



# DISCOVER the village



The Tourist Office team invites you to visit the village with our suggested itineraries. Select your favourite or do all of them! Friezes, “trompe-l’œil”, murals, viewpoints and sculptures are the highlights to discover on these walks ... we invite you to pay attention to them!

## THE VILLAGE, THE PORT AND THE BEACHES

Departing from the Tourist Office 1, walk along the Virgile Allari quay with the sea on your right all the way to the harbour Master’s office (Capitainerie) 2. Walk up allée Mireille Delfino where you can admire on your right a magnificent plant wall. At the intersection, turn left onto avenue Denis Séméria and walk to Place Clemenceau 3, then walk down the cobble-stoned street (avenue Jean Mermoz) to the church 4, on your right. Go to the Centenaire car park where you can the access the Lindbergh quay, otherwise known as the old port 5. Continue your walk along the jetty until the lighthouse 6, then turn around and go along the “Pêcheurs” quay until avenue Jean Mermoz 7.

🕒 30 minutes 📍 1,7 km

You can extend your walk with the next itinerary, or come back to your starting point, by continuing along avenue Jean Mermoz (walking towards the Tourist Office).

## THE BEACHES AND SAINT-HOSPICE CHAPEL

Departing from number 7, walk up avenue Jean Mermoz on the left until Jardin de la Paix 1. Follow chemin de Saint-Hospice until Paloma beach 2 where you can admire the view, then continue along to the Saint-Hospice chapel 3

on the top of the hill. Walk back down the road to the Jardin de la Paix, where you’ll find another viewpoint over anse des Fossettes 1. Resume your walk along avenue Claude Vignon, past plage des Fosses 4 where you’ll see the old communal wash house. Another few metres and you’ll find passage des Fosses on your right which will bring you to the port 5.

🕒 40 minutes 📍 2,3 km

📏 40 metres (to chapelle Saint-Hospice)

You can extend your walk with the next itinerary. Continue along avenue Jean Mermoz, walk past the Church, then go up the cobble-stoned street to the Place Clemenceau square.

## THE PANORAMIC VIEWPOINTS

From Place Clemenceau 1, turn left and walk to the first intersection 2, then turn left onto avenue Claude Vignon. Walk past the “Clos Bouliste” 3 and turn right onto Montée du Cap 4. Take the stairs and admire the panoramic viewpoint over the Anse de Lilong and the pointe Saint-Hospice 5. Exit the stairs and turn right onto avenue d’Austerlitz, walk along then turn right onto boulevard Général de Gaulle 6. At the next intersection, turn right and go down avenue Marie-Louise Sabatier 7 which takes you to another panoramic viewpoint overlooking the village and the port of Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat. Continue along avenue Marie-Louise Sabatier and avenue de la Libération 8 to the village square.

Warning: some road portions on this itinerary do not have footpaths so be mindful.
